## What is it?

GlaxoSmithKline's *Science in the Summer* program in North Carolina is a **fun** and **free** science education initiative that helps elementary and middle-school children "grow into science."

Through classes held at public libraries and centers in nine North Carolina counties and taught by certified teachers, this program gets kids excited about studying science with hands-on experiments.

It follows the model of GlaxoSmithKline's *Science in the Summer* program in the Pittsburgh and Philadelphia areas, which is now entering its twenty-fourth year and has introduced more than 100,000 children to science.

GlaxoSmithKline's *Science in the Summer* program in North Carolina is sponsored by GlaxoSmithKline and administered by UNC-Chapel Hill's Morehead Planetarium and Science Center.

GlaxoSmithKline's *Science in the Summer* program in North Carolina needs high school students to work as camp assistants during week-long science camps at libraries and centers in Alamance, Caswell, Chatham, Durham, Franklin, Harnett, Johnston, Orange and Wake counties during summer 2010. The theme for these camps is "Water and Our Oceans".

During each Monday–Friday Level I and II science camp, two camp assistants help certified teachers lead daily morning sessions for second- to third-grade students and daily afternoon sessions for fourth- to fifth-grade students. A total of 40 elementary students will attend each camp.

**You must be 16 years of age or older and a current high school student to apply.** The hourly rate for camp assistants is **\$8.25**. Hours for Level I and II camps are **9 a.m.–4:30 p.m.** or **10 a.m.–5:30 p.m.** with a 45-minute lunch break depending on the camp location. Camp assistants could possibly choose to help at more than one science camp.

Camp assistants are required to attend a Level I and II training session on either **Saturday, May 22** or **Saturday, June 26** at Morehead Planetarium and Science Center in Chapel Hill depending on the start date of the Level I and II camp. Employment is contingent upon your availability to attend and complete the required training sessions. Morehead will provide lunch and reimburse mileage for the training session.

Please complete and submit the attached application form, along with a reference letter from one of your high school teachers. An interview with Morehead staff will be required for final applicants/candidates. Encourage your friends to apply, too!
